

Welcome back to school for 2019!

Tēnā koutou kātoa, Dear Parents,

Welcome back to school and welcome to our new faces - Mrs Smith and her daughter Lottie, Miss McGrail, Liam and Cruz. We hope you all enjoy being at Argyll East School. We begin the school year with 70 students and we're off to a great start - lots of happy children, catching up with old friends and making new ones.

Wednesday will be our regular newsletter day, (we are early this week to keep you informed before the Waitangi Day holiday).

We are working on improving our recycling efforts in 2019 with a focus on plastics. This Friday, we welcome Harry Robinson, (not the Harry we all know in ruma toru), from the CHB District Council to our assembly, to teach us about different types of plastic and how we can recycle them. ACIDITY OF DRINKS - a message from the Dental Nurse

The pH scale measures the acidity or alkalinity of a solution. Pure water has the **neutral** pH of 7. Solutions with pH values lower than 7 are **acidic**. Milk is 6.8 and is considered LOW risk. Fizzy drinks and juices can range from pH2.3 to pH 3.9 and are HIGH risk. The level of acid, which can erode the surface of the teeth, is **not** normally published on the drinks. ACIDITY of drinks is a HIDDEN danger. Drinks considered low in sugar may still contain acid. It is wise to consider any drink, other than water or milk, a potential danger to your child's teeth.
