

Board of Trustees Report

Our first BOT meeting of the year was held last week. We did a walk around of the school grounds and have noted that the buildings and surrounding area are in good shape. This has been validated by a recent inspection from a Property Advisor from the MOE and our latest ERO report. One of the highlights has been the new sandpit area which has been a hit with the kids.

Our current school role is 74 pupils with a number of children expected to enrol before the end of the year.

Teachers will continue to do Professional Learning Development around structured literacy. Te Reo Maori will be a stronger focus for our teachers this year with the Professional Growth Cycle focusing on building capacity for this with our teachers. All classes will be using the Prime Maths programme this year and there will be a Teacher Only day later this term which will focus on the new maths curriculum.

The Board has approved the Senior Camp, which will be held at El Rancho in Waikanae in week ten of this term.

The seniors are looking forward to Technology hopefully commencing next week. While the CHB Technology Centre is being relocated to CHB College, Rachel Smith and Ben Phillpotts will be visiting schools to deliver one-to-one lessons.

The Home and School Committee has some great fundraising ideas planned for the year ahead. They work hard to help fund the bus, sports uniforms, school camp and much more so please support their tremendous efforts.
