Welcome back to school for term 2. It's great to see everyone again, happy, healthy and ready for learning.

A big welcome to Courtney Hall who is relieving for Vicki in Rūma Tahi. Courtney is settling in and finding her feet with our lovely little juniors. We wish her a very happy time at Argyll East over the next twelve months. We will have a morning tea for parents in Rūma Tahi and playgroup next Tuesday at 11am. Hope you can make it!

Our term has started well and the weather is working in our favour for some orienteering activities. Miss Allen and Mrs Smith set up some cool courses with differing levels of difficulty for students to experience. Children in their buddy teams have had fun racing around, navigating with their maps and marking off each control point as they reach it. Great skills being developed through orienteering!

We enjoyed the Kahurangi Maori Dance Company performing for us on Monday afternoon. "Te Whawhewhawhe and Te Marama" looked at how to deal with anxiety and fear through controlled breathing and self belief. A very strong singing group with a good message. Our thanks to Toitōi Hawke's Bay Arts and Events Centre and Mary Kippenberger (a local) for sharing this performance with us.

Thanks to everyone who came along to our Whānau Day at the end of last term. We really enjoyed the day and hope you did too. It's great to celebrate all of the cultures within our school and to learn about what is special to each of our families. We have a wonderful school community and we love learning more about each other.

One of our focuses for this term is Energy. We have recently participated in MOE School Energy Efficiency Trials which involved having a school energy audit and a Carbon Footprint for our school. We have not yet received the carbon footprint report but do know that our school has low emissions which is great. We have had special meters put into the school and we can go onto the Powerradar website to see live data with real

time power consumption and comparative data for the previous 7 days. This is a real context for learning and supports our Enviroschool work. A focus on energy provides us with numerous contexts for learning and we are excited about where this focus will lead.

Teachers attended professional development in structured literacy during the holidays. At the moment we are implementing a phonics programme daily across the school which builds phonological awareness and teaches spelling rules.

Music club happens every Tuesday at lunchtime. This term we are learning to play the ukulele. Everyone is welcome to come along and join in. We have plenty of ukuleles at the school so no need to bring an instrument. Guitar lessons are continuing alongside the ukulele lessons so students can bring their guitar to school or try a ukulele instead.

Kaboom Percussion is coming to our school next Friday afternoon. The show features a mix of music and science. Sherwood School will be joining us for lunch and the percussion show. Everyone is very welcome

Lots of winter sports coming up over the next few months. School sports this term include gymnastics, Ripa Rugby and Jump Jam.

A reminder that Friday 4th June is a Teacher Only Day. All staff will be attending professional development in Digital Literacy with our cluster schools - Takapau, Sherwood, Ongaonga and Tikokino.

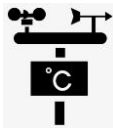

The Incredible Years is a research-based programme that aims to increase children's social skills at home, early childhood centre and school. It has also been found to be helpful in reducing aggression and behaviour problems.

The programme also helps to:

- develop positive family relationships
- provide parents with strategies to prevent misbehaviour
- provide a support network for parents

What the course covers:

- play / special times
- praise & rewards
- effective limit setting
- preventing & handling misbehaviour
- problem solving
- communication

Programme Details:

- for mothers, fathers and caregivers only (sorry no children) – bring a support person if you wish.
- the programme is suitable for those caring for children between 3-8 years.
- Each session runs for 2.5 hours.
- 14 sessions in total.
- breaks for school holidays.
- is run in a small group (14- 18 adults), with 2 trained facilitators.
- no cost
