


Morning tea will now be from 11am-11:25am and lunch will be from 1pm-1:50pm. We know the students will all be thrilled to have more time to be with their friends. If the great playground behavior continues this will be a permanent change.



On Tuesday, at the Board of Trustees meeting, we made a necessary adjustment to our school account system. Going forward, we will be introducing a capped limit of \$500 on family school accounts. Once an account reaches this limit, any further costs for bus fees, activities, trips, or other school-related expenses will require upfront payment. In our small school, every cent plays a vital role in ensuring we can continue to offer enriching opportunities, and unfortunately, carrying significant debt is not sustainable for us. We understand this change may present challenges for some families, and it was certainly a difficult decision to make, but it is a crucial step to ensure the financial stability of our school for all our students. We will also be sending out accounts on a monthly basis, rather than termly, making it easier for families to keep track of their account balances.

Next week we have our Senior then Junior Gymnastics Festivals. On Thursday we have 22 students competing in the Elementary B (Boys and Girls), Elementary A and Advanced competitions. On Friday the students in Rūma Tahi and Rua will be heading to Tikokino to all participate in the junior competition. Thank you very much to all our parents who have offered to transport students to these events.

This weekend is a long weekend with King's Birthday on Monday. I hope you have a lovely break with your families. I have 3 out of 4 of my children celebrating their birthdays over the weekend so there won't be a lot of rest happening in our house! See you all back next Tuesday.
