Board report

Our current role sits at 77 students with a number of new enrolments expected before the end of the year. We have another busy term with Gymnastics, Elsthorpe 5s and Hawkes Bay Rugby sessions planned as well as the Ngati Whai Festival near the end of term and a trip to the planetarium for the seniors.

We discussed the closure of the technology block which is currently held at Waipawa School. At present we are unsure where the new venue will be but there are different options being explored.

The new school logo looks great. Beck Wheeler has been a huge help in making this happen. We are looking into including it into school uniforms as well as on a new marquee for sports events.

Cam Ritchie has done a lot of work on the old school building. It's looking refreshed and even has lovely new blinds. We are also working on developing a breakout space between Ruma Toru and Ruma Wha. This will act as a quieter space to do one-on-one teaching.

Julie presented the results of the latest standardised testing. There is good progress across all three efforts. This is a useful tool to offer further support to students who need it as well as measuring the progress of students as a whole.

Home and School have just finished up their pie fundraiser which was very successful. The next big event on the calendar is the Argyll Ball on September 28th. The Home and School committee work extremely hard to fund many things for our school including the senior camp and they subsidise a generous amount of our bus fees. They have some great ideas for developing a permanent obstacle course at school. If anyone is keen to come along to meetings and join the committee, your attendance would be warmly welcomed.

We appreciate the majority of families who pay their invoices on time. For those that have outstanding accounts, a board member will be in contact with you shortly to discuss payment options.

It was great to see so many families attend the open morning earlier in the term. We are planning on planting our riparian area later in the term and look forward to making a family day of it.

This Friday our teachers will be having a teachers' only day. This should further support the implementation of Mataiaho (the refreshed NZ curriculum).
