Kia ora e te whānau,

Term 2 is coming to an end and it sure has been a busy one! A real highlight for me was the weekly rotations where I got to work with students from different classes. It is great building relationships and having fun with students of all ages. We really pushed ourselves to learn how to weave harakeke and I was so proud of the way everyone showed perseverance. There was a lot of frustration and a few tears, but they were all very proud of their results. Some students even went home to harvest flax and continue weaving at home.

Thanks to all our families who joined us for our Matariki celebration last week. It was fantastic to get so many trees planted! All the practice that went into waiata and tī rakau was worth it when the students all performed with confidence and good humour. It was also a real joy to see everyone sitting together and enjoying the food that the students had harvested, cooked, baked or preserved. We even had someone from the Hawkes Bay Regional Council come out to further investigate where the nests are, but there were no wasps to be found. We will continue to work with them to try to find them.


