

POSSUM POISON LAID ON HAWKE'S BAY RIVER BERMS

Rural Pest Services Ltd is going to carry out possum control in the following areas starting from the 1 July 2023 through to the 30 May 2024 on the following Rivers from the boundary fence or stop banks to near the river edges. WAIPAWA RIVER, MANGAONUKU STREAM, TUKITUKI RIVER, TUKIPO AND MAKARETU RIVERS, NGARURORO RIVER AND TUTAEKURI RIVER

All toxic material will be dyed green/blue. Warning signs will be displayed at all access points into the operational area when work is in progress and will remain in place until toxin caution periods have expired.

All baits are poison and are harmful to humans, especially young children. Because of risk of poisoning from baits and carcasses please keep dogs and other animals under control.

#### AED NOW AVAILABLE AT TE ONEPU HOMESTEAD

Maraekakaho Rural Fire Brigade has installed a publicly accessible AED (defib) at the intersection of Raukawa, Argyll and Te Onepu roads, approximately half way between existing one on Whakapirau Rd and Argyll East School. Thanks to Anna and Ian Foster for letting us put this on the fence at the entrance to their property, and Maree Gallagher for organising things there. Note that it's installed on the back of the fence, with the green AED sign facing the road. If you need the AED, simply call 111-Ambulance for the access code (the same one as the units at Maraekakaho, mid-Whakapirau Road and Raukawa), punch it in, and open the cabinet.
