

In our final Board of Trustees meeting for the year we looked over the Analysis of Variance data for the end of year results. This data reports on all year 2-8 students' results in maths, reading and writing. The end of year data compares students' results to those of the mid year testing and showed an obvious improvement across the board. This is a great testament to not only our students but our teachers and teacher aides. As mentioned at the end of last year, we will be increasing the bus fees as of term 1, 2025. The fee will increase to \$75 per child per term with a maximum cost of \$150 per family per term.

The Home and School Committee held their meeting this week as well. This year we see a few members step down from their roles or move on. We wish to acknowledge Emma Oliver who has been on the Home and School Committee for 10 years.
