Tonight we have our Back to School BBQ from 5.30pm - 7pm. This is an opportunity to meet with your child's teacher and to socialise with our school community. Some games will be set up and a sausage sizzle will be provided. Please BYO refreshments. We hope you can join us.

Our valued caretaker Wade is moving on to a new position. Wade has been at our school for a number of years and we really appreciate all he has done for us.
