The lightest wind recording on the Beaufort Scale was 0, the strongest wind was 4.

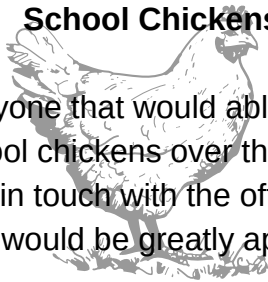
